

From the Rectory

Dear Friends,

Many of you will be spending time with relatives this Christmas. Beyond our immediate family, I grew up with only two first cousins, but with a very large number of second cousins many of whom I didn't know at all. Tracking down one's ancestors is a very popular exercise. One of my close relations was excited to discover a well-known five-times great grandmother. I did point out that we had 127 other, similar relations: four grandparents, eight great-grandparents, 16... 32... 64...

Jesus' own human ancestry is set out at the beginning of both Matthew and Luke's gospels – long lists of names that at first glance don't look worthy of attention. Matthew 1 starts, 'A record of the genealogy of Jesus Christ...' Starting with Abraham, and including David, the list goes through to 'Joseph, the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ.' Verse 17 continues, 'There were fourteen generations in all from Abraham to David, fourteen from David to the exile in Babylon, and fourteen from the exile to the Christ.'

Luke, perhaps not wanting to lose his readers attention too early on, waits until the end of Chapter 3 to give us his version. His begins the other way round, stating, '(Jesus) was the son, so it was thought, of Joseph...' and goes back 37 generations including David to 'Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.'

For a first century Jew, a person's family line was very important. Matthew's version essentially sets out Joseph's lineage, and Luke, Mary's ancestors; both were direct descendants of David's. There are probably more generations than those listed, as genealogies were often compressed so that not every generation was mentioned specifically. Being a descendant of Abraham, the father of all Jews, Jesus was fulfilling the Old Testament prophecies about himself.

Some people don't find it easy to accept the circumstances of Jesus' birth without a human father (and similarly the other two great miracles of his life, his resurrection and his ascension); for many small children, such considerations just aren't an issue. Like perhaps some of you, I can just recall the joy of childhood Christmases of long ago, un-tinged by adult angst. When his disciples rebuked some children, it was Jesus who said, "I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." When the 25th comes, may you have a Christmas sprinkled with childlike joy.



We received lovely feedback recently from a parent who said: "We had a fun-packed day and the staff go above and beyond to make it special for us."

The Wealden Community Lottery by Freya Holman

The Wealden Community Lottery was set up to help good causes throughout Wealden, fundraising to make improvements to services across Sussex. From every £1 ticket sale, the chosen cause receives 50%, with an additional 10% going to support the local community. There are weekly cash prizes up to the value of the £25,000 jackpot, and with odds of winning a prize at 50:1 it's a low risk fun way for residents to support their local community.

Groombridge Community Post Office and Shop on the Corner joined the lottery to boost income and protect the asset, which is an important part of the village. The post office has generated more than £2,000 and helped to promote the service and encourage new users. One of the first purchases made with the funds was a new card stand.

Sam Caitlin from the Post Office said, "The lottery was straightforward when signing up and the support given to us throughout the process, from the initial application to acceptance of application was brilliant. The information we requested was readily available to us and any questions we had were answered quickly. All the resources on the webpage are tailored to your specific cause, which saves a lot of time and effort. They can also be used in different ways from

posters to social media which means you only need five minutes a week to market the lottery."

Over the past 18 months, a total of £79,030.80 has been raised for good causes and the central fund combined, and we've had 3,343 winners, totalling combined cash prizes of £14,250, plus a total of 7,610 free tickets have been won.

Not-for-profit organisations such as charities, sports clubs, residents' associations, community groups, parish councils, village halls and PTAs are all welcome to join the lottery and are



encouraged to sign up and start benefitting from the lottery. Notes From Withyham Parish Council

Wealdlink – This month, writes Di Kelly, Withyham Parish Council Chair, I thought you might like more details about the Wealdlink, community bus, that is supported by parish councils, including Withyham Parish Council. Wealdlink offers a weekly unique door-to-door shopping service for those who have difficulty accessing public transport. It is for all ages – you don't have to be elderly or infirm – it will pick you up from your home in villages located on and around Ashdown Forest and take you to Crowborough, Tunbridge Wells or Eastbourne. It will give you time to do your shopping, relax over a coffee and enjoy the town before safely returning you to your home. Passengers need to register with the office on o1892 771332 and the friendly staff will discuss your travel requirements and help book your journey, up to 24 hours in advance.

Wealdlink buses are driven by trained volunteers from the parishes, and much appreciated by passengers for not only driving them safely door-to-door but for helping them carry their shopping into their homes. More drivers are required so if this something you might like to do we have a couple of volunteer drivers from Groombridge who would be happy to chat about their experience. One said, "We all derive pleasure from helping other people and from being with friends. It is a happy day when I drive Wealdlink passengers." Wealdlink's future was in the balance when grants were withdrawn during 2006-07, but thanks to the sponsorship from eight parish councils it survived, and acquired its first bus in March 2011. The parish councils also sponsor the shopping service. There is also the opportunity for community groups to book Wealdlink for trips out. Visit **www.wealdlink.co.uk** to find out more.



It could save time while raising funds to provide free care for those facing terminal illness and their loved ones.


In exchange for a donation of £20, the Hospice elves will collect and recycle your 'finished with' Christmas tree. No hassle, no waste, and no needles in your car.

Computer Corner Digital Travel by Roger Lyon



A selection of really useful travel aids... **Planning and Booking** – Apps like **Skyscanner, Kayak**, and **TripAdvisor** allow you to compare prices for flights, hotels, and car rentals, helping you to find the best deals. Check directly with the airlines' websites – they may have excellent deals not found on comparison sources. **Triplt** consolidates all your travel details into a single itinerary, automatically

pulling flight details, hotel bookings, and rental car reservations from your email – no manual input required. It also gives you alerts about gate changes and even suggests alternative flights in case of delays or cancellations.

Getting Around – Apps like **Google Maps** and **Citymapper** make navigation easier, offering turn-by-turn directions for walking, driving, or public transport and other handy features. For example, **Google Maps** allows you to download maps for offline use – essential if you're in a place with limited or no mobile data. Beyond basic translations, **Google Translate** also offers a "Conversation Mode" where you can speak into your phone, and it will translate spoken phrases backand-forth between two languages in real time. Great for quick interactions like ordering food or asking for directions. Also, it can translate text on signs, menus, or labels by simply pointing your phone at them – no typing required.

Keeping Organised – You can store boarding passes, loyalty cards, hotel reservations, and event tickets in one place using **Apple Wallet** or **Google Pay**. Apple Wallet also integrates with travel apps like **Airbnb** and **Booking.com**, so your accommodation details can be accessed as easily as your flight information.

Safety – WhatsApp allows you to share your live location with friends or family, useful when meeting people in unfamiliar places or during solo travel. TripWhistle is an emergency app that lists local emergency numbers for 196 countries. It can pinpoint your location and allow you to share it with emergency responders. What3Words is great for pinpointing locations to meet or visit.
